# PROBLEM: Learning Loss During The Summer Months SOLUTION: A Summer Filled With Learning And Exploration

id you know that research shows that students from low-income homes experience a cumulative learning loss during the summer months? This is why Homework House continues to program during the summer months. This past summer **over 100** students K-12th grade participated in new learning opportunities.

Our K-5th grade students participated in a summer literacy program in partnership with the Azusa Library. We found that approximately **70%** of our students signed up for a library card for the



first time! These students also swam, experienced soccer competitions and learned how special they were.

**Thirty** Homework House teens participated in different activities during the summer. They included a week long camping experience at Lake Arrowhead, a trip to the University of New Mexico for two-weeks and engagement in leadership development activities.

Summer was fun and full of opportunities to explore new possibilities.
